

Why Have Rates Increased?



has received authorization from the Ontario Energy residential distribution rates.

For residential customers consuming 1,000 kWh per month, the increase in your total cost will be 9.6% or \$8.88 per month.

In Ontario's new electricity market, local electrical distribution utilities are now to be run as commercial companies. This rate increase is needed to partially cover the new financing costs Milton Hydro Distribution Inc. incurs as a commercial business and to cover payments in lieu of Income Tax which commenced October 1, 2001.

The Ontario Energy Board regulates the rates that have changed. The Ontario Energy Board has approved the phase in of the distribution rate increase over a three year period. The rates printed in this publication represent the distribution rate increase relating to the second year of the rate mitigation plan.

Rate Transition

The first bill you receive after the above rates take effect may include charges incurred prior to the date of the change. Charges incurred prior to the rate change will be billed at the old rates, and the balance of your charges will be billed at the new rates.

A Simplified Look at the Competitive Energy Market.

What do I have to do ... and what will it mean to me?

The Ontario Government has announced that the market will open on May 1, 2002. This will open up one part of your electrical bill (the "energy charge") to competition.

You have two choices:

Choice 1: You can choose to buy your energy from any number of "energy marketers" (also called retailers or resellers). These companies may offer you the opportunity to buy electricity at a "fixed rate" by signing a contract for an extended period of time. At this point, no one knows for sure what the market prices for electricity will be. This contract could protect you from market price increases during the term of the contract or conversely, you may pay more if market prices go down. Remember it is a legal contract. Make sure you understand all of the terms before signing.

Choice 2: You can choose to wait and see. If you don't do anything, you will receive energy from Milton Hydro Distribution Inc. at the market price. During the first year after market opening the Ontario Energy Board has forecasted market prices will average around 4.3 cents a kWh (excluding any rebates).
